<b>Advanced Placement-</b>	Students can earn credit for college level courses who prove via examination that they have achieved university-level proficiency in Advanced Placement courses.
<b>Chronic Absenteeism-</b>	The Kentucky Department of Education defines a student as being chronically absent if he or she is present 90% or less of full-time equivalency (FTE). Chronic absenteeism is calculated by dividing a student's FTE present minutes by FTE instructional minutes and rounding to the nearest whole percent. A student must be enrolled for 10 or more days.
<b>Cluster Schools (elementary only)-</b>	Schools that are "clustered" or grouped together for purposes of exchanging students.
<b>ECE-</b>	Exceptional Child Education (Students with Disabilities).
<b>Elementary/Middle Diversity</b>	An equitable balance of students, utilizing a multiple criteria approach to categorize the district into two geographic areas (A/B) based on three factors (minority students, educational attainment of adults and median household income).
<b>English as a Second Language -</b>	English Learner (EL) students enrolled in the English as a Second Language (ESL) program.
<b>% Free/Reduced Lunch-</b>	Percent of students at school who receive either a free or reduced priced lunch.
<b>Homeless-</b>	Homeless: Children and youth who are sharing the housing of others including relatives and friends due to a loss of housing, economic hardships, or other similar reasons. This group includes children and youth temporarily placed by CFC or who are unaccompanied youth living in emergency runaway shelters, public or private nighttime shelters, special car facilities, spouse abuse centers, hotels or motels, and uninhabitable places such as cars, camping ground or parks, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, or bus and train stations. Highly migratory children and children awaiting permanent foster care placement are also considered homeless.
<b>Magnet Career Academies-</b>	Program where students are provided opportunities to focus on a specific technical career along with regular studies.
<b>Magnet Program-</b>	Unique, school wide curricula that are mandated by JCPS policy. Students are drawn from entire district.
<b>Market Share-</b>	The % of students in a resides location attending a Jefferson County Public School.
<b>Median Household Income-</b>	Data represents a weighted average of median household income by the total population of JCPS students in a zip code.
<b>Mobility Index-</b>	A comparison of re-entries to total enrollment (expressed as an annual percentage).
<b>Students Requiring 5 yrs. In the Primary Program</b>	3rd Graders who were retained and returned the following year to the 3rd grade.
<b>Parent/Teacher Conference Data-</b>	Number of conferences reported for the fiscal school year in Infinite Campus.
<b>Program Capacity-</b>	Utilization of school building.
<b>PTA Membership-</b>	Number of reported PTA memberships for the school year indicated.
<b>% Resides/Attends-</b>	Percent of JCPS students that live in schools resides area and attend that school.
<b>Spending Per Student-</b>	The current expenditures made in a year divided by the end of year average daily attendance in the school. The dollars spent reflect actual salaries of staff. The school figure also reflects categorical programs in the school, as well as, Exceptional Child Education Programs and English as a Second Language Programs. (Per Pupil spending calculations are based on MUNIS formula provided by KDE.)
<b>Stability-</b>	Number of students who finish a school year and enroll at the same school the following year compared to the total finishing at that school.
<b>Student Enrollment-</b>	Includes all students enrolled in the school.
<b>Student Transfers-</b>	Students that transfer from one school to another due to a hardship or program need.
<b>Suspension Incidences-</b>	Number of school suspensions for the school year indicated.
<b>(Teachers) Masters Degree or Higher-</b>	Percent of All teachers by school who have advanced their education and enhanced the professional competency of their initial teaching certification.
<b>(Teachers) National Board Certified-</b>	Number of active teachers who attain National Board for Professional Teaching Standard Certification.
<b>(Teachers) % Attendance-</b>	% of active full-time teachers not on long-term leave to include: (1) Teachers that are at school (Present) OR, on professional leave (Excused)
<b>(Teachers) % Retention</b>	% of (active full-time) teachers at a particular school at the end of a school year and returned to the same school the following year.
<b>Traditional Program-</b>	Schools that offer strong basic skills in a highly structured educational environment.
<b>Comprehensive School Survey - Student Satisfaction-</b>	Is an average composite score based on three similar items associated with school satisfaction.
<b>Comprehensive School Survey-Student School Climate-</b>	Is an aggregated score of multiple items reflecting different aspects of the whole-child approach to education.
<b>Comprehensive School Survey - Response Rate-</b>	Is the percent of respondents who responded to the Comprehensive School Survey.

# Kentucky's Accountability System at a Glance

Kentucky's accountability system has students at its center—ensuring they are well-rounded, postsecondary ready and prepared with knowledge, skills and essential dispositions to successfully pursue the pathway of their choice after graduating from high school. The system has several key goals:

- Promote higher levels of student learning and achievement.
- Reduce achievement gaps and ensure equity.
- Build a culture of high expectations and continuous improvement.
- Communicate a clear and honest understanding of strengths and areas for improvement in schools and districts.

The system uses multiple academic and school quality measures, not a single test or indicator. Reporting of each indicator will be determined by setting standards for very high to very low performance on system indicators. Scores from each indicator are combined to create an Overall Accountability Score. Measures and weights in the charts below contribute to a school's/district's overall accountability score and color rating. Additional information is reported to provide a more complete picture of education in Kentucky. Results are reported in an online Report Card including disaggregation of individual student group data and include reported-only measures. Individual student reports are issued to parents/guardians.

## Senate Bill 158 and Kentucky's Accountability System

SB 158 (2020) amended KRS 158.6455, Section 1 to create an accountability system that will include an annual meaningful differentiation of all public schools in the state using multiple measures that describe the overall performance of each district, school and student demographic group.

- Performance will be based on a combination of academic and school quality indicators and measures known as "state indicators."
- Those indicators will exclusively include student assessment results, progress toward achieving English Language Proficiency (ELP) by English learners, quality of school climate and safety, high school graduation rates and postsecondary readiness.
- Beginning with data from the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years [delayed to 2021-2022 and 2022-2023], the accountability system overall performance for each district, school, and student demographic group determined by the state indicators will equally combine current year performance, called "status," and improvement from prior to current year, called "change." Note: considerations for very high-performing schools will take place during standard setting.
- For all students as a group and separately for individual demographic groups, "status" will be determined beginning with the data from the 2021-2022 academic year, by using the current year performance. "Change" will be determined beginning with the data from the 2022-2023 academic year, by using the difference in performance of each indicator from the prior year to the current year. Note: "status" for the EL indicator will include student progress.
- For each state indicator, there will be five status levels ranging from very high to very low and five change levels ranging from increased significantly to declined significantly.
- The percentile cut scores for status and change levels will be based on a distribution and will be approved by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) and the Local Superintendents Advisory Council (LSAC). The cut scores will remain in place for at least six years unless existing cut scores no longer support meaningful differentiation of schools as required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
- Beginning in the fall of 2022, KDE will develop an online "dashboard" of system results with color-coded performance levels. Results are reported for each state indicator and overall performance on status (2022), and status and change (2023) by district and school for all students as a group and separately for individual demographic groups. Overall performance will aggregate all available data for the state indicators.

## State Indicators in the Accountability System

State Indicators
<b>State Assessment Results in Reading and Mathematics</b> <i>Reaching the desired level of knowledge and skills as measured on state required academic assessments in reading and mathematics. Student performance is aggregated to school, district and state levels.</i>
<b>State Assessment Results in Science, Social Studies and Writing</b> <i>Reaching the desired level of knowledge and skills as measured on state required academic assessments in science, social studies and writing. Student performance is aggregated to school, district and state levels.</i>
<b>English Learner Progress</b> <i>Improvement on the English Language Proficiency Exam by English Learners. English learners' progress is included in the calculation using an English learner growth table.</i>
<b>Postsecondary Readiness</b> <i>Attainment of the necessary knowledge, skills and dispositions to successfully transition to the next level of his or her education career. To demonstrate postsecondary readiness, high school students must earn a high school diploma or be classified as a grade 12 non-graduate AND meet one type of readiness (Academic or Career).</i>
<b>Quality of School Climate and Safety</b> <i>Measures of the school environment. Perception data from surveys that measure insight to the school environment.</i>
<b>Graduation Rate</b> <i>Percentage of students earning a high school diploma compared to the cohort of students starting in grade 9. Kentucky uses a 4-year adjusted cohort rate and an extended 5-year adjusted cohort in accountability, which recognizes the persistence of students and educators in completing the requirements for a Kentucky high school diploma. 4-year and 5-year rates averaged for accountability reporting. Schools with a 4-year graduation rate of less than 80 percent are identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI).</i>

**NOTE:** The accountability system performance for each district, school, and student demographic group determined by the state indicators will be based on a combination of annual performance called "status" and difference between prior year and current year, called "change."

### Minimum N-Count

For accountability, a minimum of thirty (30) students per level (elementary, middle, and high) will be required in each student demographic group to be included in school calculations. Public reporting will follow U.S. Department of Education (USED) and Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) guidelines.

Accountability System Considering All Indicators
Performance levels will be based on a percentile distribution. Through a standard-setting process, the cut scores required for each of the five levels of performance will be established. The aggregation of all data will determine a school's overall performance rating (color).

<p><b>Overall School Color Rating</b> <i>Based on the strength of performance on indicators as combined in the overall accountability score.</i></p> <p><i>The Overall Performance Rating for elementary, middle and high schools will be reported using a color rating system to communicate performance of schools. Status and Change
For each state indicator, there will be five status levels ranging from very high to very low and five change levels ranging from increased significantly to decline significantly. The percentile cut scores will be approved by the KDE and the LSAC.
Beginning in Fall 2022, the KDE will develop an online "dashboard" to display the accountability system results. A color-coded performance level for each state indicator will be displayed in a straightforward manner on the dashboard for overall performance on status (2022), and status and change (2023) by district and school for all students as a group and separately for individual demographic groups. <u>Overall performance will aggregate all available data for the state indicators.</u>
The KDE will be working with the USED on federal approval.
Below is an example of a 5 x 5 colored table for a state indicator that includes status and change. Tables will be developed for each indicator and may be different. Note: From highest to lowest, the five performance levels are: Blue, Green, Yellow, Orange, and Red.

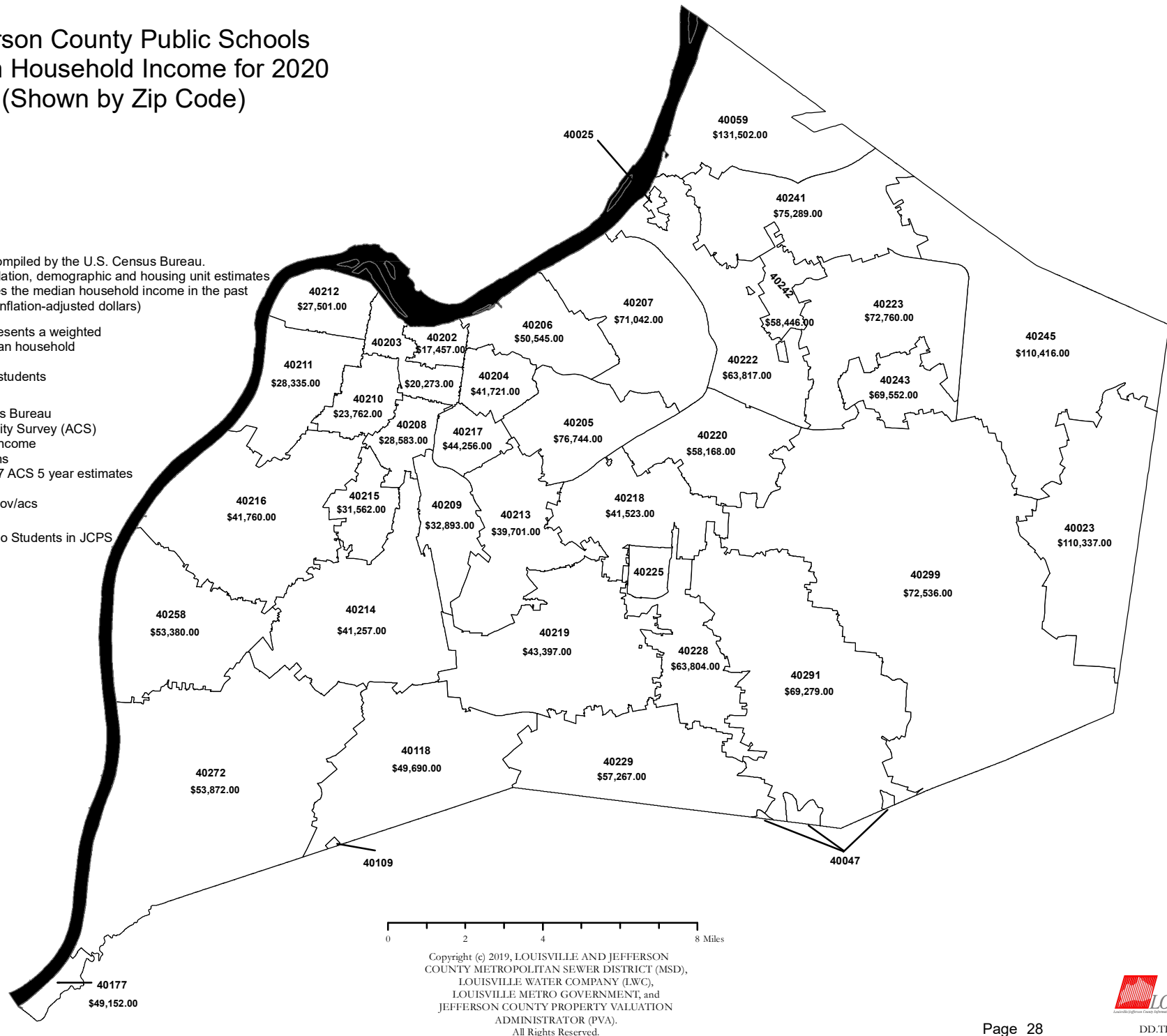

The JCPS Student Assignment plan implemented in the 2012-13 school year uses multiple criteria to categorize the diversity in the district. Each United States Census block group in the district is defined as a Category 1, Category 2 or Category 3 by combining the median household income, the percentage of non-white population, and the average level of adult educational attainment in the block group to yield a single category. Each student is classified as Category 1, Category 2, or Category 3 based on the Category of the block group in which the student resides.


The diversity index of a school is calculated as a weighted average of the number of students in each Category. The diversity index of a school should be within the range of 1.4 to 2.5 (the “diversity guideline”). The diversity guideline of a school includes student enrolled in the English as a Second Language program; but does not include students enrolled in a self-contained Exceptional Child Education program. The diversity guideline does not include students in alternative or special schools.



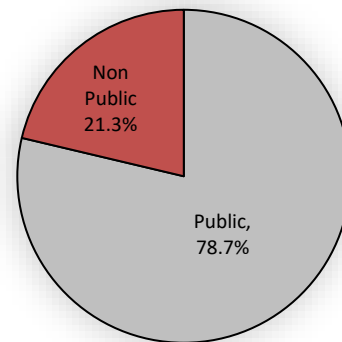

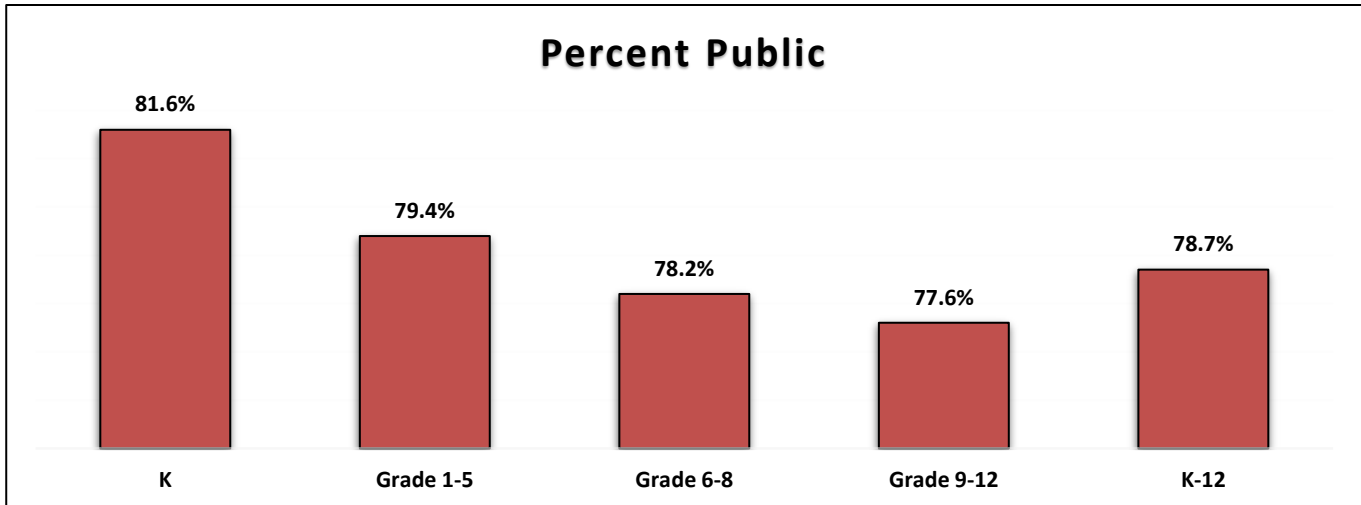
### Market Share K-12

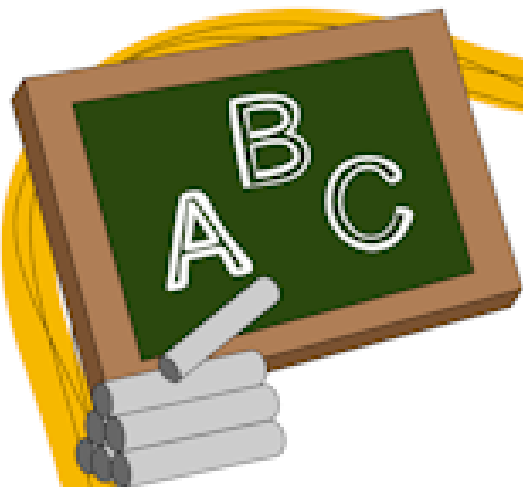

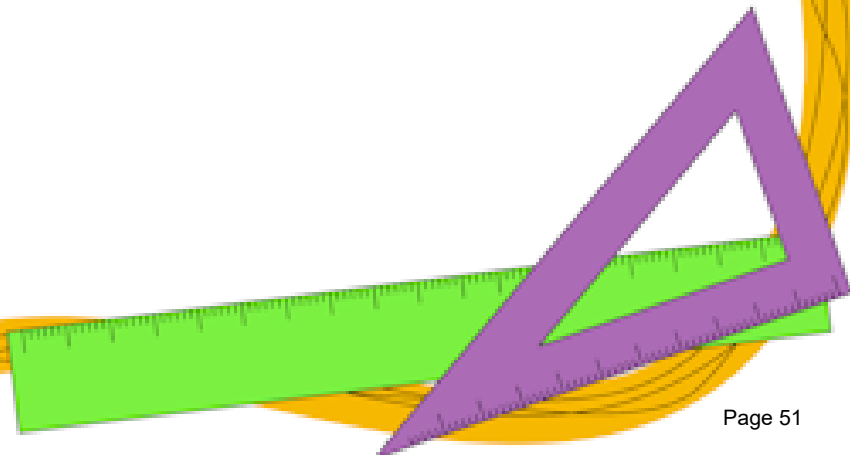
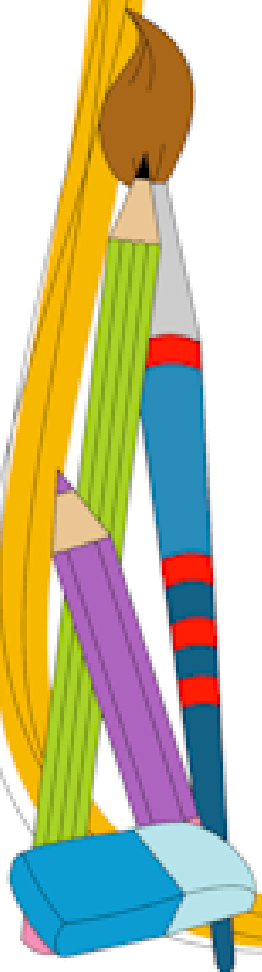
